Parent observation in a Montessori environment is a valuable practice that allows parents to gain insight into their child's classroom learning experience and development.

The Pre-primary Montessori and Primary Montessori environments hosted parent observation from September 21st to October 4th, 2023. Two to three parents were invited per environment daily. During these observation sessions, parents sat quietly to witness the remarkable independence and self-driven learning that Montessori students exhibit.
