Primary Montessori: Making math fun, I, II, and III std enjoyed a special trip to a local supermarket on January 10th and 11th, 2024. Grade 1 children wisely spent ₹40 each on stationery and snacks. Grade II and III children collaborated to invest ₹90 each towards Ellu Bella ingredients for Makara Sankranti. This effort connected students with cultural traditions and enriched their understanding.
