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Kannada Rajyotsava

Munawar (Montessori Teacher)

Vidyanjali dedicated this year's Kannada Rajyotsava celebration to poet-philosophers. On October 31st, festivities unfolded at the Pre-Primary Montessori and Primary Montessori wings. Pre-primary 1st-year students explored Dr. Rajaratnam's life, joyfully singing his songs. 2nd-years enjoyed Karnataka's folk dance through PPTs & videos, while 3rd-years delved into Mysore, Bellary, Kodagu districts, and Karnataka's culinary and traditional highlights. CBSE and Primary Montessori Grade 1 students creatively drew and colored the Karnataka flag. Grade 2 & 3 sang G P Rajaratnam's poems, while CBSE Grade 2 & 3 sang patriotic songs.



On November 1, CBSE IV – X std celebrated Rajyotsava spectacularly. The poem "Hesaraayithu Karnataka" captivated the audience. Mr Nandesha captivated the audience with insights into the captivating world of Santha Shishunala Sharieff's poetry, followed by a mesmerizing invocation song and a warm welcome. Students recited verses of renowned Kannada philosophical poets. Insights into the

Parent Presentations

Parent presentations provide practical insights for parents to support Montessori principles at home and nurture a holistic approach to a child's development.



Pre-primary Montessori hosted presentations for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd-years on November 25, 2023. Presentations covered Oral Phonetical Analysis, Number rods, walking on a line, Pouring liquids, Geometrical solids, and Sandpaper Letters for 1st-years. 2nd-year parents delved into concepts such as Constructive triangles, Open sounds, Decimal part – addition, Ribbon frame,

Phonograms, Trinomial cube, Change game, and the Snake game. 3rd year parents were involved in presentations on Stamp game - Subtraction, Samyuthakshara, Adjectives, short bead frame - addition, and Homophones.



Parents realized that each presentation serves a specific purpose in the child's development. They discovered that Montessori presentations focus on purposeful activities to enhance a child's independence, social skills, and cognitive abilities.

Career Guidance Orientation and Counselling

Parents of IX and X std students were orientated on Career Guidance on Nov. 21 to align their understanding with the diverse career landscape. The session informed parents about evolving career options, industry demands, and the need to support their child's interests. Parents engaged in the interaction and were overwhelmed with the multitude of career options that are available to children nowadays.

The counselling helped students choose the right career path based on their educational and professional choices. It also helped students to understand their strengths, weaknesses, their interests and provided them with a clear picture of the career paths available to them.

Mr Shameer C.K. from Thrissur, Kerala, the speaker of the Orientation and Counsellor gave the parents and students a clear picture of how to make a shift from a general understanding of life and work to a more specific understanding of the realistic and practical career options that are available to them.



After the one-on-one counselling, nearly every parent went home satiated with the options that were presented to their children taking into account their abilities, talents and aptitudes.
