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Workshops for Grade X

To ensure targeted learning, students submitted their areas of difficulty five days prior, allowing Mrs Vijayakumar to tailor her approach effectively. The workshop covered critical aspects such as map marking, time management, competency-based questions, and assertion-reasoning techniques. Practical strategies for writing structured long answers, avoiding errors, and tackling MCQs were emphasized. Mnemonics were introduced for easy retention, and updates in textbooks were discussed.

Students engaged in hands-on activities, solving real-time scenarios to enhance conceptual clarity. Both the interactive sessions encouraged active participation and critical thinking.



This monumental structure, carved from a single piece of granite, stood as a symbol of peace and renunciation.



Their journey then took them to Halebidu's iconic *Hoysaleswara Temple*, a magnificent shrine dedicated to Lord Shiva. The students were left spellbound by the intricate soapstone carvings, each telling a story of devotion, mythology, and war. The final stop of the day was the *Chennakeshava Temple* in Belur, an architectural masterpiece of the Hoysala dynasty. The breathtaking sculptures and exquisite detailing showcased the artistic brilliance of a bygone era.



The adventure continued on January 8, as students from Grades 6 and 7 set out to explore the historic town of Chitradurga. Their first destination was the Vijaya Vittala Temple, where they witnessed the grandeur of ancient Vijayanagara architecture.
